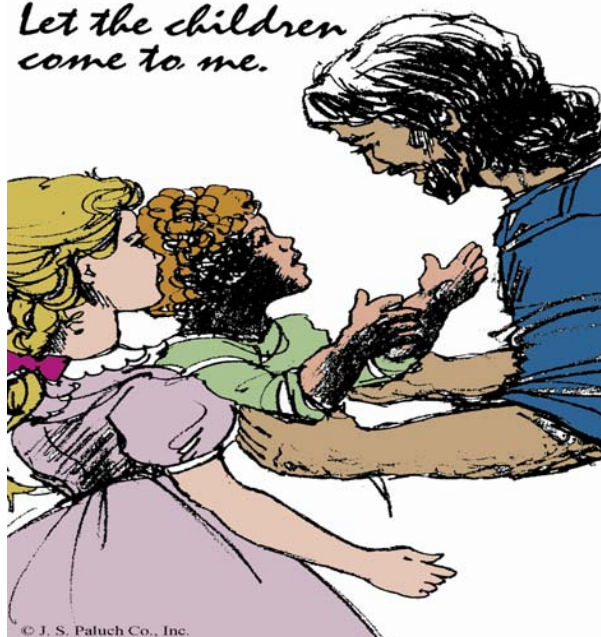

*What is our "primary duty" as faithful, faith-filled citizens?*

On this Respect Life Sunday, I share with you the words of one of my contemporary heroes, St. Louis Archbishop Robert Carlson. He recently wrote these beautiful, but sobering, words in his weekly column, Before the Cross.

"The defense of human life - from the moment of conception to the moment of natural death - is our primary duty as faithful citizens. All human life is sacred because every human being, without exception, is made in the image and likeness of God." It is always important, but especially so during times of national elections, that we "call out for the defense of those who are most vulnerable: the unborn, the disabled, the elderly and those who for whatever reason find themselves on the fargins of human society."

"I have said many times that I consider legalized abortion to be the most serious threat to the defense of human dignity that our nation faces. There are many vitally important life issues that Christians and all people of good will must address, but unless we change our minds and hearts, our laws and practices, on the fundamental right to life of all unborn children, we will never be a healthy society. In the words of Blessed John Paul II, we will be a 'cult of death' and not a 'culture of life.' "

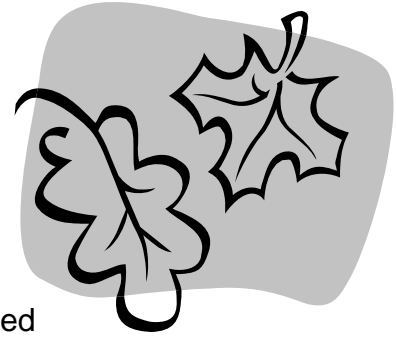
"The weakest and most vulnerable members of our society need our help. Whenever human life is threatened (by abortion, euthanasia, human cloning or the destruction of human embryos for research), we must oppose those actions as intrinsic evils. (Those weakest) need us to elect legislators, judges, and other government officials at the local, state, and federal levels who are proactive and unambiguous in their defense of all human life."

Defending human life then, is our primary duty as faithful Catholic citizens. Let us remember that when we vote this fall.

Last week we celebrated two great feast days, the feast of the Holy Archangels and the Holy Guardian Angels. Angels are written about throughout the Bible. The name "angel" is taken from the Greek translation of a word meaning "messenger". Angels are spiritual beings, created by God. They do not have bodies, and you do not turn into one when you die and go to heaven. They were created by God to be His messengers and to obey His will. We honor the angels because of their relationship to God, and because they are also protectors of human beings. Each of us has our own Guardian Angel; even though you cannot see him, he never leaves your side. Throughout the day, talk to your Guardian Angel, ask him to protect you and to help you with the hard things you face.

*O Angel of God, my guardian dear, to whom God's love entrusts me here, ever this day be at my side, to light and guard, to rule and guide. Amen.*
